# <u>Parents Meeting for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion</u>

Families who would like to have their child(ren) who are seven years of age (grade 2) or older prepare for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are asked to contact the parish office or go to our website <a href="https://www.stpat-stmary-railton-odessa.com">https://www.stpat-stmary-railton-odessa.com</a> and download the **First Communion letter and Registration Form.** 

Preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist at St. Patrick Parish, Railton, involves the children's participation in lessons that will take place in the Parish Hall and by extension at home. This way parents are directly involved. There will be a mandatory parent meeting on Tuesday, 15 October 2024 at 7:00pm in the Parish Hall. If you are not able to be there on that day the same meeting content will take place Sunday, 20 October at 12:30pm (following the 11am Mass) in the church. The meeting will consist of an outline of the program as well as encouraging you to be supportive of your child and to try your best to be interested in what your child is doing. Parents who want to register their child for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist can go to the parish website (see above) and download the Registration Form.

You are asked to fill out the required information and include a copy your child's <u>Catholic Baptismal</u> <u>Certificate</u>. <u>Please bring them to the Parent meeting</u>. <u>Do not return the registration form to school</u>.

### 1st Frontenac Guide Pathfinder Ranger Unit

About 1.5 years ago MJ taught the Guides and Pathfinders how to make milk bag mats. Several of the youth members enjoyed process and we decided to continue on with the project of making milk bags matts.

This summer we were able to deliver 13 matts to Kingston. These matts are used by persons who are unhoused. The mats give warmth to the ground, help keep the wetness away from the sleeper and insects and snakes are not fond of the plastic so they stay away from the sleeper. Over all this makes for a more comfortable rest.

The youth have discovered that each mat uses 184 plastic bags and about 2-3 hours to make from beginning to end.

We will begin collecting bags again just after Thanksgiving. We ask that all bags be clean. One bag with sour milk on it can ruin several other bags and then all of them must be destroyed. Thank you to everyone who donates CLEAN, FLAT bags! You save the youth hours of flatting and sifting through dirt bags.
